Although “Castillon, Côtes de Bordeaux” is not exactly a household name, it has long been a treasure trove of good-value Bordeaux beloved of connoisseurs. Historically, the appellation was known as “près-Saint-Emilionais” and the geographical proximity with Saint-Emilion is unquestionably reflected in the wines.

Type of soil: Mostly gravelly

Varietals: 70% Merlot, 25% Cabernet Franc and 5% Cabernet Sauvignon

Dominant Flavours: Black pepper nose. Spicy, peppery mid-plate finishing with lush dark fruit flavors and mid-weight textured tannins.

Vinification: Traditional fermentation, temperature controlled tank.
